

HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES

Be sure to familiarize yourself with our COVID-19 guidelines. Please note, in-person camp may be canceled at any time up until and during the camp season if COVID cases rise and we feel it would not be safe for our staff and campers. These guidelines are subject to change at any time. If you or your child are feeling ill, DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO CAMP! Contact our Camp Director to notify us of any illness. If a camper becomes ill and tests positive for COVID-19, guardians of campers in that session will be notified and given any further instructions.

We are a nature camp. Camp will primarily be held outdoors and under tents, unless there is severe weather such as a thunderstorm. If the weather forecast is calling for rain, please be sure to send your camper with a raincoat, rain boots, or even a change of clothes, as we will be outside.

Camp Supplies

Below is a list of things your child will need at camp: Lunch and two snacks (mid-morning & afternoon) (refrigeration available.) Please place in a labeled backpack for carrying things on hikes

1. Extra pair of shoes and socks
2. Warm clothing such as a sweatshirt or sweater
3. Waterproof raincoat or poncho
4. A ball cap or hat for sunny days
5. River Shoes (close-toed shoes that can get wet – Keens are a favorite, old sneakers work well, no open-toed water sandals, please)

Please label the bag and all contents with your camper's first and last name (lunch bags, clothing, water bottles, etc.)

Campers should arrive each day in comfortable clothes (shorts are fine) that can get dirty and closed-toed shoes. Campers should arrive with sunscreen and insect repellent (if desired) applied, so they are ready to begin the day.

Please do not bring food that requires heating. Please leave electronic devices such as cell phones, handheld game/music devices, or tablets at home as well as any toys or other personal items. Thank you!

Camp FAQS

Hours of Operation

Audubon Summer Day Camp is held Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Drop off your camper no earlier than 8:50 AM and arrive promptly at 4:00 PM for pick-up.

Sign-in/Out Procedures Each Day

Parents/Guardians accompany their children to camp and sign them into the program on the attendance sheet when they arrive.

Parents/Guardians also sign their children out upon pick up. Campers should be signed in and out every day with their assigned counselor by parents or an authorized adult (18 years and older). Please do not leave children unattended at the Center before the camp day begins at 9:00 AM. Please be prompt or call to inform staff if you know if you will be late.

Emergency Plan

The camp staff is trained to care for minor injuries at camp. Should a serious injury occur, the Camp Director or Assistant Director will notify you or an emergency contact person.

If your child will be absent from camp, please call Kate at Audubon Center at Bent of the River at 203-405-9113 before 8:45 AM.

Medication and Sunscreen/Insect Repellant

All campers should come to camp wearing sunscreen and be prepared to reapply it when necessary. Staff cannot supply sunscreen or insect repellent.

Camp Age Groups

Camp groups are arranged by grade. Naturalists are campers entering grades 1 - 4 in Fall 2024 and EcoDiscoverers are campers entering grades 5 - 8. Eco-Warriors are campers entering grades 9 - 12

Camp Hours and Length

Camp sessions last one week, Monday – Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Every Friday family is invited to join us for a camp slideshow in the barn at 3:30 pm.

Camp Registration

Camp spots will be reserved only after registration is completed and tuition is received.

Pricing

Tuition is \$350 per camper per week. For the both camps the week of 4th of July, tuition is \$280.00 Eco-Warriors is \$375 per camper.

Summer Camp

Campers at Bent of the River's Audubon Summer Day Camp explore nature in a fun, safe environment within the 700 acres of our nature sanctuary. Audubon Camp fosters curiosity through outdoor exploration that helps campers develop an understanding of the natural world. These unique experiences and adventures can grow into a lifelong appreciation for our environment.

Our camp days are filled with a variety of activities—including hiking, brook walks, river exploration, crafts, nature-themed games, live animal interactions, and birding. For the safety of our campers, families, and staff, we strictly follow the latest COVID-19 safety guidelines.

Our staff is selected for their experience and skills working with youth in environmental education and for their interest in local ecology and natural history. All staff must pass background checks and are required to hold current CPR and First Aid certifications, making camp a safe place to learn about and experience nature. Our staff has helping hands each week from our Leaders in Training, experienced campers gaining skills in environmental education leadership.
