




Southeast Alaska boasts more than 350 bird species, including the highest densities of Marbled Murrelets and Bald Eagles in the world. In spring, hundreds of thousands of shorebirds stop to feed in the Southeast on their way to their breeding grounds in the Arctic. Tens of thousands of colonial seabirds dot the coast in the summer. Birds found nowhere else, such as Queen Charlotte Goshawks and Prince of Wales Spruce Grouse, inhabit the region's ancient forests. The Southeast Alaska Birding Trail features 192 sites across 18 communities, from Craig to Yakutat.
