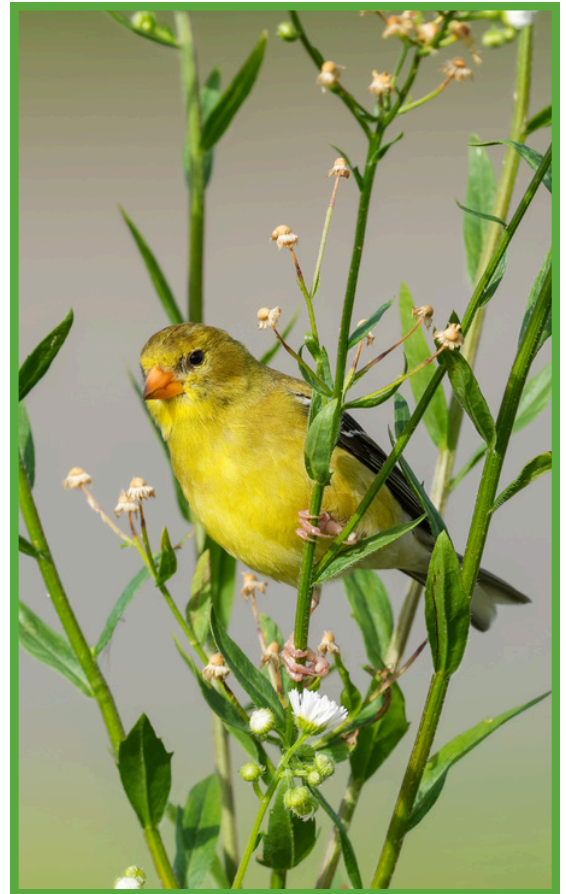


Support Conservation in the Farm Bill



Healthy working lands are essential for birds, farmers, ranchers, forest landowners, and communities across the country. The farm bill is **our nation's largest investment in voluntary conservation on private lands**, helping improve wildlife habitat, soil health, water quality, and rural economies.

Right now, Congress has an important opportunity to **strengthen conservation programs that support both people and birds**. The House-passed farm bill (Farm, Food, and National Security Act of 2026) includes critical support for voluntary, science-based conservation programs that help steward America's farms, ranches, and forests. The Senate can build on this progress by strengthening programs like the Conservation Reserve Program to promote native pasture and good grazing opportunities, and by providing more on-the-ground support for privately-owned forests.
